THE 26TH FUTURES CONFERENCE “SUSTAINABILITY, TEMPORALITIES AND FUTURES”

9–10 June 2026, Turku, Finland

The Finnish Futures Research Center (FFRC) and the Finnish Futures Academy (FFA) at the University of Turku organise the annual Futures Conference every year, providing an opportunity to meet, exchange experiences, and discuss current topics related to futures research and forecasting.

International researchers, organisational representatives, business professionals, and students from all over the world gathered in the spirit of future-oriented information exchange, research, analysis, and collaboration.

For this reason, we considered it important to participate in the conference to present the development and results of a multi-phase international educational initiative focused on developing future-oriented competences among logistics students in the four Visegrád countries.

The presentation **“Learning to Navigate Time: Students Working with Scenarios to Shape Future Logistics Competences for Sustainability Transitions”** covered, on the one hand, the V4 project's methodology, which integrated future-oriented approaches, and on the other hand, how this enabled students (113) from the four partner countries to compare their cultural assumptions, share their disciplinary perspectives, and collectively develop alternative visions of the future, in line with the project's objective.



By showcasing this collaboration, which included both national and international workshops, we were able to highlight the potential of internationally coordinated, forward-looking education to empower students to understand and shape a sustainable future.

Sharing these results is particularly important because the methodology is intended not only for ongoing application

within partner universities but also for long-term capacity building in the V4 region and beyond, extending beyond the field of logistics.

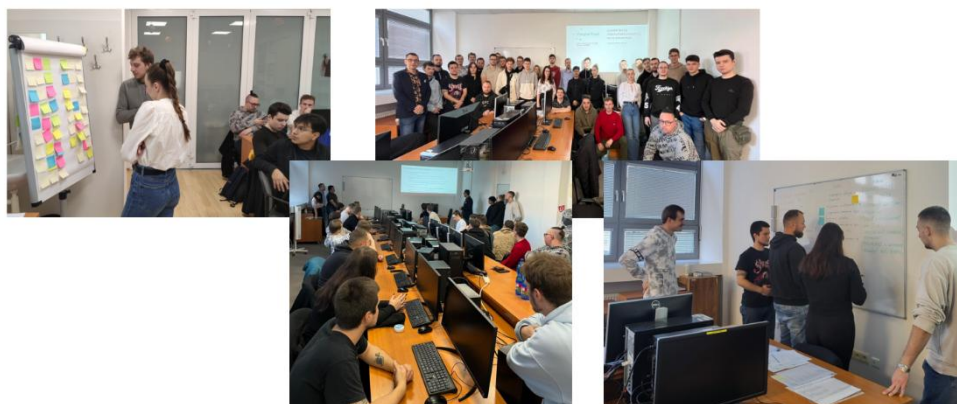
